PURPOSE: To establish the role and function of the tactical crime suppression unit (TAC).

SCOPE: This policy and procedure applies to officers assigned as TAC Agents.

REVIEW RESPONSIBILITY: Investigations Bureau Major

POLICY: The TAC will serve as a specialized enforcement unit conducting investigative operations, providing patrol and investigations support, and utilizing various surveillance and decoy measures to prevent the commission of, or to apprehend a subject in the act of committing a crime.

PROCEDURES

1. ADMINISTRATION

- a. The administration, supervision and control of TAC shall be the responsibility of the Investigations Bureau Major.
- b. Direct supervision is delegated to the TAC Sergeant. The unit will be staffed by officers selected for special assignment as TAC Agents.
- c. TAC Agents shall be deployed in uniform, non-uniform or decoy attire as determined by their supervisor.

2. AGENT SELECTION

a. Officers assigned to TAC will be selected in accordance with the posted assignment announcement. The assignment posting may be used to increase the number of agents or to fill a vacancy.

3. FUNCTIONAL OBJECTIVE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- a. The TAC is hereby established for deployment to locations within the Department's jurisdiction where criminal and non-criminal activity impacts the Department or its objectives. The objectives of TAC are:
 - i. To respond to activities impacting law enforcement services.
 - ii. To serve as a mobile crime deterrent component.
 - iii. To supplement patrol units.

- b. TAC responsibilities shall include, but not be limited to:
 - i. Undercover operations.
 - ii. Surveillance.
 - iii. Security at special events.
 - iv. Covert criminal investigations.
 - v. Dignitary protection details.
 - vi. Decoy operations.
 - vii. Organized crime/vice investigations.

4. OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

TAC, Detectives and Patrol shall maintain active liaisons to ensure a coordinated effort in the identification and apprehension of criminal suspects.

- a. When deployed in uniform, TAC Agents will maintain a high visibility in the targeted area(s), making arrests as necessary. Target areas will be assigned by the Investigations Bureau Major or Administrative\Investigations Division Assistant Chief or the Chief of Police.
- b. When deployed on surveillance or another specialized detail, a TAC Agent will notify the on duty Patrol Sergeant. Notifications may be accomplished during shift briefings or via electronic messaging from a mobile data terminal (MDT).
- c. Requests for TAC assistance from other divisions shall be forwarded to the TAC Sergeant.
- d. Undercover operations shall be closely supervised and approved by the TAC Sergeant. The TAC Sergeant will provide regular briefing of on-going operations to the Investigations Bureau Major.
- e. Undercover operations and\or targeted enforcements should follow a detailed plan which should include but not be limited to:
 - i. an Offense Report number from Communications
 - ii. identifying and informational review of the suspect(s)
 - iii. suspect(s) contact and agent(s) safety considerations
 - iv. neighborhood or target area surveillance review
 - v. supplying involved officers with documentation and information essential to the operation
 - vi. necessary equipment and resources
 - vii. established means for routine and emergency communications
 - viii. providing back-up security for agents
 - ix. pre-operational briefing with all involved law enforcement participants

5. USE OF EQUIPMENT AND VEHICLES

- a. When deployed in uniform, TAC Agents have access to marked and unmarked patrol cars.
- b. Requests for special equipment or vehicle needs shall be forwarded through the chain of command to the Administrative\Investigations Division Assistant Chief via the TAC Sergeant.
- c. The TAC Sergeant shall determine what equipment is needed and ensure that all agents are properly equipped.

6. GLOSSARY

<u>Surveillance:</u> mode of investigation using overt and/or covert, continuous or periodic watching of persons, vehicles, locations, or objects to obtain information relevant to activities and/or identities of an individual or group.

<u>Undercover Operation:</u> secretive investigation using a pretext to gain the confidence of persons suspected in criminal activities.

<u>Uniform:</u> for the purpose of this policy refers to meeting the requirements of policy and procedure 4.2.1.7; the nature of assignments may require appropriate attire as approved by the TAC Sergeant.
